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

#### **HOLY ROSARY**

#### From Satanist to Saint: Bl. Bartolo Longo

The Rosary can convert the most hardened sinners, defeat God's enemies, preserve the Faith, and make us saints. Why is it so powerful? It is because it consists of prayers composed by God Himself, and is the memorial of all that Jesus Christ has done for us, filling our hearts with gratitude toward God and giving us the strength to avoid anything that could offend so good a Friend.

The power of the Rosary to make saints is illustrated by the story of Bartolo Longo. This former satanist priest died peacefully and praying his Rosary at age 85 on October 5, 1926. His last words were, "My only desire is to see Mary, who has saved me and will save me from the clutches of Satan."

Bartolo was raised in a devout Catholic home in Latiano, Italy. Unfortunately, he joined the Freemasons when a student at the University of Naples. He rose rapidly through their ranks, eventually being "ordained" a priest of Satan in the Masonic Lodge.18 Later, thanks to the help of a good friend who was also a Dominican priest, he broke with the diabolical society and set about making reparation for the evil he had done.

#### CODE OF CANON LAW - MARRIAGE 14

### The Investigation of Freedom To Marry

Canon 1067 - The conference of bishops is to issue norms concerning the examination of the parties, and the marriage banns or other appropriate means for carrying out the necessary inquiries which are to precede marriage. The pastor can proceed to assist at a marriage after such norms have been diligently observed.

Since marriage is not a private possession of the two parties but a matter of public interest, both ecclesial and secular societies have traditionally enacted legislation concerning basic requirements for marriage. Such legislation is aimed at assuring that the parties will not enter a relationship that would be detrimental to themselves, possible children, or the community. Church legislation in this regard has always involved some form of pre-nuptial investigation. Thus church authorities would be satisfied that both positive and natural law demands would be met.

Prior to the fifth century this inquiry was conducted by the bishop and was originally prompted by a concern about incestuous marriage or marriages with infidels. From that time on, the obligation was incumbent upon the parish priest. General legislation enacted at ecumenical councils (especially Lateran IV and Trent) referred to pre-nuptial investigations, public solemnization of marriages and the banns. These provisions reflected a concern for marriage in relation to the welfare of the parties, family life, and the community.

Two matters are dealt with: the examination of the parties by the pastoral minister in order to determine freedom to marry and the traditional publication of the proposed mar-

riage by means of the banns. The latter amounted to an inquiry within the community to discern possible impediments.



#### The Examination of the Parties

The preparatory steps alluded to in canon 1063 should have indicated a general readiness for marriage. Next there follows the examination of the parties aimed primarily at:

- (a) determining that the parties are free of impediments;
- (b) ascertaining that they have sufficient knowledge of Christian doctrine:
- (c) determining that their consent is free.

The episcopal conference is charged with issuing norms on how the investigation is to be carried out while the obligation itself rests with the local ordinary. Given the diversity of the population in many countries; especially the United States, it seems that broad norms on a national level would enable the local ordinary to make appropriate adaptations for his own situation.

In the past the examination often consisted simply in filling out certain forms. More recently dioceses have expanded the approach to include various tools such as the pre-marriage inventory. Conceivably some form of examination concerned with the spiritual or faith capacity of the parties could be included as well. The examination is

concerned with the couple's awareness of the ecclesial dimension of marriage as well as their willingness to follow the Church's teaching.

## The Obligation For the Examination

The obligation to see that the examina-

tion is carried out is incumbent upon the local ordinary. The ultimate responsibility for conducting it belongs to the pastor who has the canonical right to assist at marriages in his parish (c. 530, 4"). In other words, a pastoral assistant or other minister or lay person may in fact conduct preparatory steps and the examination, yet it is the pastor's responsibility to see to it that this is done correctly.

The gravity of the obligation is obvious both from the nature of sacramental marriage and its relation to the life of the community. Past legislation seriously admonished priests and bishops to examine carefully those planning marriage. Penalties were attached to the neglect of this obligation, including suspension from the benefice and even suspension from office. The obligation then is not simply to conduct the investigation but to conduct it

#### The Inquiry

The Church has conducted an inquiry among the members of the community by means of the banns since Lateran Council IV. The 1917 Code contained detailed legislation on the banns (CIC 1023-1028). Its purpose was to uncover impediments or other circumstances which would impede a valid and licit marriage. Although it was effective in the past, the institute of banns has presently become something similar to an ecclesiastical social register in many places. Consequently, the conference of bishops is charged with enacting legislation on banns which will respond to distinct pastoral needs.

The inquiry must be structured to protect the rights of the parties and preserve confidentiality. On the other hand, it must provide a realistic avenue for people to present to the proper authorities serious objections to the marriage or important knowledge about the parties.
